## **PROGRAMME UPDATES**

It's been a year of **changing** alert levels and **changing** programming! But amongst it all we have been continuing to offer life **changing** adventures in the wilderness places of Aotearoa. Here are a couple of highlights from 2020.

#### PAPAMOA COLLEGE:

We ran our first ever programme for Papamoa College, taking a group of young men on a challenging programme they will likely never forget. As they braved terrible weather and challenging terrain they dug deep, growing as a team, growing in resilience and growing as people. Teacher, Tanya Laybourn comments:

"These 10 boys cycled, abseiled and tramped. They had a full-on time and were certainly challenged - but on the whole they had a great experience. The abseiling challenged them individually and the three day tramp challenged their perseverance and teamwork.

They worked hard and managed to summit Mt Te Aroha in the rain, wind and cloud on the last day! They should be able to talk about how hard work is worth it and how your attitude matters not only to yourself but to your teammates. Their euphoria was incredible as they took their last steps to the bus in the pouring rain!

They deserve to be very proud of themselves, and the Journey experience is now a tool in their "kete". "

#### ADVENTURE AOTEAROA MÃORI

We were thankful to Recreation Aotearoa and Sport NZ to receive funding to run a pilot programme for young Māori interested in pursuing a career in outdoor education and adventure tourism. Adventure Specialties Trust facilitated the trip, which ran in partnership with seven other outdoor and adventure tourism providers. Activities ranged from an overnight trip on a waka, canyoning, mountain biking, rock climbing and white-water rafting. The activities provided an experience of Pacific way-finding and environmental navigation, adventure tourism, conservation, iwi led business, youth work and outdoor education. We made space for korero and pātai with role models working in each area along with people from appropriate training pathways.

Feedback from the programme showed it had achieved its aim of supporting Māori with increased connection, belonging and participation in outdoor activities in a way consistent with a Māori worldview. We would love to see this become a regular pathway programme and increase the number of people identifying as Māori in our industry.

Below are some thoughts from the team:

- "I loved how they all shared whakapapa of the area and gave us time to kōrero. {It was a} Massive taste of how the industry rolls, and the diff ways to get into the industry was awesome to learn."
- "The activities! Mad mahi! These experiences have made lifelong memories and differences... I feel very honoured for the opportunity."

"Great privilege to have the speakers come through and give us just that better insight into the industry! Found it super inspiring!"

"Activities were dope – lovely people, sick vibes, mean gear, great energy – pushed us out of our comfort zones and built confidence and self-belief."

"Amazing, warm, funny, energetic, uplifting and motivating team facilitators."
